

I was happy to supply my comments and the entry of Skylink into the decision, regarding Net Neutrality. The inclusion of the Minister of Innovation, Science and Economic Development in making a decision is giving me some concern.

In June of 2017, the Minister of Innovation, Science and Economic Development approved the sale of Norsat, a Vancouver-area satellite technology company to a Chinese firm. The Chinese immediately delisted the public traded company so that not even the SEC could see what they were doing. I will suggest all Intellectual Property was sucked out of the Company before Norsat's office doors closed on the date of the sale. If there is a Huawei communication tower on the building of Norsat today, the security of Canada is being compromised.

If you need to know other locations where this is likely to occur, all you need to do follow the Chinese purchases/acquisitions in Canada. Angbang, a Chinese company, bought B.C. retirement homes in Feb 2018 (in essence a financial **sovereign** guarantee by taxpaying Canadians).

That same year, Anbang also bought Vancouver's Bentall Centre. These are only a few cases where the Minister of Innovation, Science and Economic Development was unable to connect the financial dots. If he is sitting at the table regarding this issue, he may cause damage to National interests and security.
