As of April 1st, 2021, the Canadian Intellectual Property Office (CIPO) is transitioning to the use of Canada Post epost Connect™ as a means of delivering mail in lieu of paper mail for outgoing PCT International correspondence. The Canada Post epost service allows CIPO to meet its requirements for Protected B documents. Please note that the Canada Post epost Connect™ is external to CIPO and CIPO is using this service as method of delivering correspondence electronically.

Should you want to receive correspondence using this external service, CIPO invites you to provide your preferred email address of correspondence, and provide written and signed consent to receive correspondence via epost.

CIPO requires that you provide written and signed consent to receive all future outgoing correspondence from CIPO in their role as a receiving Office (RO), an International Search Authority (ISA) and an International Preliminary Examination Authority (IPEA) via epost, until either you remove your consent or a new method of outgoing correspondence is adopted by CIPO.

The letter of consent may be returned via mail, facsimile or CIPO's General Correspondence service and must clearly indicate your name, email address and address. The letter must also be signed and dated.

Please note that until consent is received, outgoing correspondence will continue to be sent by regular mail.

We, AGENT OR FIRM, agree to receive all future outgoing correspondence from CIPO via Canada Post epost (an external electronic service) in CIPO's role as receiving Office (RO), International Search Authority (ISA) and International Preliminary Examination Authority (IPEA) under the Patent Cooperation Treaty (PCT), until further written notice is received by CIPO.
